## FIELD VISIT AT TELINEELAPURAM ON 08-12-2023

**Aim:** The field visit to Telineelapuram aimed to study migratory bird patterns and assess local conservation efforts.



Brief Report: Telineelapuram Bird Sanctuary are located in <u>Srikakulam</u> district of <u>Andhra Pradesh</u>, <u>India</u>. <u>Telineelapuram</u> is a village located 65 kilometers from <u>Srikakulam</u> in <u>Tekkali</u> mandal. Every year, over 3,000 pelicans and painted <u>storks</u> visit from <u>Siberia</u> to these villages during September and stay on till March.

The Tekkali creek and the villages in its vicinity like Telineelapuram, Ijjuvaram, Naupada in the district have become a seasonal resort for the winged tourists coming from as far as Siberia in Russia, Malaysia, Hungary, Singapore and Germany apart from 113 different species of inland birds, a majority of which are migrants from other states.


Siberian birds, particularly the Siberian cranes and other migratory species, embark on long journeys to escape the harsh Siberian winters. They travel thousands of kilometers to reach warmer regions, such as parts of India, including Telineelapuram in Andhra Pradesh. These birds are known for their striking plumage and impressive stamina. Observing them offers insights into migratory patterns and ecological balance. Conservation efforts are crucial for their survival, as they face threats from habitat loss and climate change. The presence of Siberian birds in wintering grounds underscores the interconnectedness of global ecosystems and the need for international cooperation in wildlife preservation.

**Outcomes:** Observed rich biodiversity, notably Siberian migratory birds. Gained insights into successful community-led conservation practices and identified areas for enhancing wildlife protection and eco-tourism in the region.




